There are six pages in the provided InDesign document. On each page on the left there is formatted example text, and on the right a plain text version.

Using the skills learned in class, make the text on the right look exactly like the example to the left. Be sure to read the **Key Skills** listed at the top of each page.

Since the text frames on the left are editable, the complete answers to this exercise are already given to you. Your task is to gather what information you can from the example (by selecting text and reviewing the Character and Paragraph panels), and then apply those formatting options to the text on the right. Be sure to practice the tools and keyboard shortcuts discussed in class. It's more important to practice than to finish the exercise quickly.
