Working with CSS Typographic Properties

Overview ::

For each of the CSS typography properties in the provided HTML file, write selectors to target the HTML elements, then write CSS rules that alter the text in the manner specified.

Read the text in the HTML document—instructions are embedded within.

Process ::

Write rules that only target the elements within the `<section>` element provided for each property. Each section has an ID attribute named after the CSS property. Use the pound sign (`#`) to target elements based on ID. For example, to target the elements under *text-indent*, you would write this selector:

```
section#textindent p { ... }
```

Not all elements are within paragraph tags (`<p>`). There are some within header and unordered list tags, as well as a number of classes applied to help you target specific elements of the page. Use a period (`.`) to target elements based on classes (`section#IDName p.className`).

Do all of your work in the **styles.css** file located in `common/css/`. Do NOT edit the styles in any other stylesheet, nor make changes to the HTML file other than adding a link to Google Fonts as required.
