## Typographic Expression of the Elements of Design

### Assignment ::

For this Design Lab, express the meaning of a word or idea through the **size** and **space** (position) of letters on the page. Designers often think this way when creating logotypes, posters, or editorial headlines. Each composition becomes a narrative that implies motion and change. We will be creating six expressions, selecting only from the word list below, using the same typeface for all—Futura PT, from Adobe Fonts.

Pick six words from the list below to express:

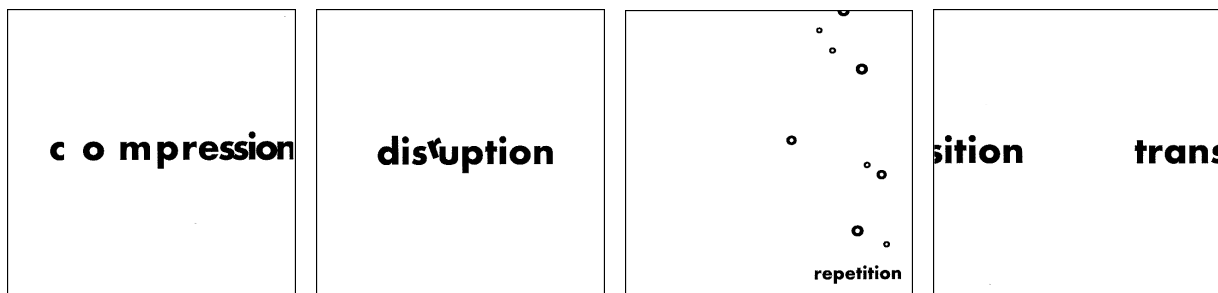
compression	evolution	obfuscation

### Specifications ::

Use the **provided InDesign template** for this Design Lab. The document already has six squares in which to do your work. When done, print

- *Expression size:* Square orientation (5" wide x 5" tall)
- *Number of expressions:* 6
- *Typeface:* **Use only the type Futura PT family** of fonts (from Adobe Fonts)
- *Printing:* Grayscale on 12"x18" (100% size)
- *Naming:* Rename the file using your last name
