Assignment ::

For this lab, we will be comparing content and navigation design between a site's desktop and mobile versions. In small groups, locate sites that match the criteria listed and view their home pages on both desktop and mobile browsers. Write your answers to the questions listed in the space provided.

Process ::

Select one website for each category listed, review them (focusing on the home page), and answer the questions listed. If you choose a site that does not have a mobile version, make note of that site, then find a different one that does offer a mobile version.

To view the *desktop version* of a site, simply select your favorite browser and view the site using a browser window width of approximately 1,300px.

To view the mobile version of a site, there are a couple methods to try:

• Use a mobile phone to view the site Use your phone (not a tablet) to load the site and review it.

—or—

• Use a desktop browser (Firefox or Chrome) and resize the window

If it is a response site, you should see an approximate version of the mobile design just by resizing the window. Safari is a fine browser, but its windows do not get as narrow as the other two major browsers on macOS. However, you can use Responsive Design Mode in Safari (Develop > Enter Responsive Design Mode) to view the mobile site, if you want.
